# Revolution Academy Summer Reading

Summer reading at RA serves some very important purposes:

- It protects against the summer learning loss that most students experience.
- It increases background knowledge, an essential element of reading comprehension.
- It builds common experiences among students and families.

Each student is required to read 1) Mouse and the Motorcycle by Beverly Cleary and 2) the required reading book for the grade level he or she is going into by August 14<sup>th</sup>. We encourage you to read Mouse and the Motorcycle as a family. Students may listen to an older sibling or parent read the book, or even read it to a younger family member. We think that you will find that students will have a deeper understanding and enthusiasm for the book when they can discuss it with their family. If you have trouble getting the books, let us know and we can help.

While it is fine for you or someone else to read the book to your child, please DO NOT allow him or her to watch any movie versions or read altered versions (like Disney books) before he or she has read the actual book that is required. Students will be assigned activities and assignments when they get back to school that directly use the required reading.

We also would like to caution you that we have chosen some classic literature to read; books that were written in a different time and contain material and themes that you, as a parent, might find surprising or objectionable. We believe that the universal human themes, rich vocabulary, and quality storytelling are an invaluable part of the educational experience that we want for all of our students. At the same time, we recognize that you, as the parent, should be the one making decisions about what material your child is exposed to.
